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X-ray wrongly read, lung cancer lawsuit settled for \$450,000

A lifelong smoker was sent to the hospital for a chest x-ray. The x-ray showed a suspicious gray area, but the patient was not told and no additional testing was done at that time. When she was x-rayed two years later, she found that she had incurable lung cancer. She died a year after that. Liever, Hyman and Potter and their litigation partners were retained.

A highly qualified expert physician reviewed the two x-rays and was prepared to testify as to the increased risk of harm caused by the delay in diagnosis of lung cancer. A settlement was obtained in the amount of \$450,000.
